You can bring up to 3 nice plants/gardening item. Please have the plants potted and labeled. When potting your plants please do not use leaves, keep your worms at home. Suggestions to use newspaper or coffee filters. Labels should include name of plant, requirements and care. Also, please set the pot in a grocery sack and do not water the day of the exchange, this will help keep clean up to a minimum. We use the door prize tickets for the drawing. When your number is called you pick a plant. We do one plant at a time. We do three rotations. If you only want to do one or two plants, that's fine too. If you have extra plants please save them for the plant sale.

Community Hope Center: There will be a clean up morning at the Community Hope Center, Thursday, April 13, at 9 am. This will be a general clean up. Will probably do cardboard at following workday. Please save card board, size doesn't matter. Please try to come and help. Bring your tools, water snacks, etc that you might need. We usually go for brunch afterwards.

Dig days at Sue and Bill Hiller's and Carole and John Baker's: Start time will be 9:00. Compost will be available. March speaker: Carol Gravens, St Louis Master Gardener, spent the evening with us. Carol shared her 10 favorite orchids. These were her own plants. She has 300 orchids in her home. Carol reviewed how to care for the orchids. They require good drainage, tepid water, bark and horticultural charcoal. She recommend east window for lighting, fertilize and humidity. Proper day and night temperatures. Her top 10 orchids are: Phalaenopsis, Cattle-ya Corsage Orchid, Paphiopedilum, Dendrobium, Vanda, Ludisia, Oncidium, Phaius, Phragmipedium and Bulbophyllium. The Vanda orchid appeared to be the favorite for the members. It is a large orchid, it hangs, does not require soil. It was an enjoyable evening with good friends.
