February meeting: Our speaker will be Kris Larson, General Manager and Marketing Coordinator from Theodora Farms in Godfrey. They have only been open for a few years (2019). They grow and sell vegetables to the public. They are growing, flowers, vegetables, herbs and annual fruits on land that is being transitioned to organic. They have a 10 acre farm on North Alby. They do have an online store. Please come to hear what he has to share. Maybe find a new place to obtain fresh food.

Spring Garden Nursery Trip: For members that are fairly new to the club, the spring bus trip was something members looked forward to every year. We visit garden nurseries, alternating between Illinois and Missouri. This year is Illinois. This gave us a chance to see new plants/ new varieties that aren't available in our local nurseries. You are traveling with members you may have experience with the different plants. Also, some master gardeners that have advanced training. Plus the experienced nursery staff. We stop for lunch at local eateries. Some of the nurseries used to give us a discount. We usually meet the bus at the Godfrey Walmart.

One thing that we consider when looking at the buses is storage for plants. Everyone usually has a box/ container that they put their purchases in. We have even brought small trees back.

The plan will be to visit the nurseries that were originally scheduled in 2020. We would be going to Hilltop Nursery and Garden in Sherman, ILL, Greenview Garden Center in Springfield, lunch, Pleasant Nursery Inc, and Buckley's Prairie Landscaping. Last will be Kahl's Greenhouse and Landscaping, George and Edith brother's nursery in Carlinville (one of our favorites).

Usually members pay \$10 and guests \$17, to help off set the cost. This is also a factor that could be considered.

Christy has been gathering information about buses for the nursery trip. The price of the busses have gone up. There is a yellow school bus that is cheapest.

The trip will be discussed at the Feb club meeting. We will need to know how many members are interested in going. We will need the information to make the decision if it is feasible to rent a bus. The other reason for the quick decision is to hopefully get the date that works for us.
