**February speaker:** Betsy Alexander will be back to visit us. Betsy was a public health professional for 29 years in clinical services and health education. She has been a Master Gardener since 2000 and has served on the St. Louis Master Garden Advisory committee, including 2016 chair and the training coordinator team. She is currently on the education committee and is the Speaker's Bureau coordinator. Betsy also presented the topic "Winter Damage", for us in 2016.

Betsy topic this time will be "Chocolate". We will learn where this strange and wonderful fruit comes from. We will learn the earliest history of chocolate, learn how it is cultivated and processed and then consider ways to take your chocolate addiction into your garden with "chocolate plants".

**January meeting:** John Hensly presented us with a picture tour of three botanical gardens. The first tour was the garden in Anchorage, Alaska. It is 110 acres, most of it natural habitat.

There were kitchen gardens that were needed for fresh fruits and vegetables. They had holehaufens, they were a German method of stacking and curing wood. The visitors of the garden would have to watch for bears.

Next, John shared pictures from his trip to Elche, Spain. There were many different varieties of palms. One palm of particular interest is the Imperial palm. It has 7 large branches, all growing upright. The branches are supported by metal bands to keep them from breaking. There were awesome succulents. There is a statue that has quite a history: La Dama de Elche.

The last garden is closer to home. It is the Powell Gardens in Kansas City, Missouri. It is 970 acres, home of 7 gardens. The property, at one time, had bee a dairy farm, a boy scout camp and an agricultural and natural resource center.

John did a good job navigating us thru the three gardens. You almost felt liking you were walking the paths yourself.
