<u>Donations:</u> The board members made some changes this year regarding end of year monetary donations. They took into consideration the time working on their landscaping, money spent for plants and mulch and canned goods collected that are donated to the Community Hope Center. There was discussion of other organizations in need of help. Many have been affected by budget cuts. The board decided on the following donations: \$50 - Community Hope Center, \$100– Senior Service Plus, to be designated for the Meals on Wheels program, \$100 - Bethalto Senior Service, to be designated to the drivers for medical appointments and transportation, and \$100– to Operation Blessing in Wood River. October meeting: The presentation was quite interesting and entertaining. Our speaker was Ron Scheller, owner of Nuisance Wildlife Control Service, in Mt. Olive, IL. Ron provided information regarding bats found in Illinois. There are 13 different species, all are protected only 1 is endangered. None of them are fruit eaters. They don't eat mosquitoes, they prefer moths and insects that are hazardous to other crops, such as the corn earworm. Most of the bats weigh less than an ounce. They can get through tiny openings in structures. They don't cause any damage, it is their guano and urine. They also attract "bat bugs" that can get into the living area of a house, they are sometimes mistaken for bed bugs. They can also be carriers of spores of histoplasmosis. Histoplasmosis is a fungal disease, that can infect humans, usually the immunosuppressed. When Ron handles the guano he is wearing a hazmat suit and respirator.

Bats can also be carriers of rabies. If for some reason you are bitten by a bat, usually while trying to catch or remove one from your home. Don't do it bare handed and don't release the bat. The bat would be tested for rabies and may prevent you from having to receive the rabies injections.

Bats are a special group of mammals. They avoid humans and are usually harmless. Handle them with caution. They are just trying to survive in this ever changing world.
