She has been a Master Gardener since 2000 and has served on the St. Louis Master Garden Advisory committee, including 2016 chair and the training coordinator team. She is currently on the education committee., the Outreach subcommittee of the Advisory committee and is the Speaker's Bureau coordinator. Betsy visited us in January 2016, topic was "Winter Damage".

The presentation will be **Victorian Gardens:** The Victorians loved geometric and symmetrical features in their gardens. They used extensive lawns, bedding gardens, vines and shrubs to fill their home landscapes. They were fascinated with tropical plants and lavish lawn flower beds.

January meeting: Betty Struckoff was our speaker for the January meeting. She was very knowledgeable regarding her topic, Bringing Natives Home. Betty uses a lot of natives in her own yard. She referenced Shaw Nature Reserve, Heartland Prairie at Gordan Moor Park, and the Nature Institute. She talked about native plants for the forest/woods, savannah, prairie, glades and wetlands. Betty covered a lot of plants, to many to name. Maiden hair fern, hydrangeas, green dragon - fun plant. Cardinal flowers and goats beard that are favored by humming birds. Boneset attract insects, including praying mantis. Betty shared some resources that are available. Noah's Garden by Sarah Stein, Bringing Nature Home by Douglas Tallamy and The Living Landscape by Rich Darke and Douglas Tallamy. She highly recommended the visual guide at the Missouri Botanical Garden website.
