Happy May, its been a rainy month so far. Hard to get the mowing done, but makes it easier for digging plants and pulling weeds. Of course it makes it all grow faster. Its going to be a busy month so keep an eye on your email or stay in touch with someone who does. Any changes will be communicated thru the emails. Have a good month.

Pricing: Will be at Jan's on Thursday the 11th. Rain date will be Friday, the 12th. Plants may be delivered starting Wednesday, please not before. Jan will be taking care of watering them. The plants are somewhat divided by shade and sun. Thursday at 4 pm, pricing will begin. We will use the colored plastic ware, each color is a different price. The experienced pricers will make the decisions on the price, then other members will help place the plastic ware. It usually goes very quickly. **Directions:** Jan's is about the 7th house on the right.

Plant sale: Everything is in full swing for the plant sale. **Flyers** should be going up around town. Plants should be dug and potted. You may need to trim them up prior to the sale. Don't forget to ask businesses to put the info on their marquee. Be sure and save **small boxes and flats** for the customers.

The day of the sale, we will need everyone's help for setting up and cleaning up afterwards. There will be lots of plants to be moved. Transporters will need to start around 5:00– 5:30 am. Others will be at Sportsmen's club ready to unload. Plants are sorted by sun, shade, hostas, daylilies, herbs, etc. We ask that you wear your name tags and club apparel the day of the sale.

Couple of reminders for the day of sale. Members will not pick up plants for themselves prior to 8am, and set aside. Plants will be charged for the price at the time that they are picked, not set aside till discounted prices. Please do not congregate in the walking areas, it usually is very busy the first couple of hours. Please assist the customers, if you can't answer their questions find someone who can. Please assist customers with their plants, to check out and to their cars. There will be some wagons available.

The Greenhouse: Thursday, May 18, 6:30 pm. We will be visiting the greenhouse at the Nature Institute in Godfrey. It is a small operation, primarily for spring and early summer. Ann Osburn will be our hostess. Ann will go through the seed collecting process, keeping the seed and what they do in the beginning of seed production, planting and raising. Ann has been gardening since she was about 4. Grew up taking care of her mom's flowers and plants. Got into raising veggies. Did some landscaping, worked at White's nursery and at Lowe's. Ann has been with the Nature Institute about a year and a half. She has learned quite a bit about prairies and why the plants are needed. Ann joined the garden club in February 2017. **Directions:** Follow Homer Adams Pkwy/IL-3, turn right onto W. Delmar. Approximately 1/2 mile, turn left on to Levis Lane. Turn left onto S. Levis Lane. After about 1/4 mile you will see the sign for the Nature Institute and the Lodge, **do not turn**, continue straight. In a little bit you will see 2 dark brown garages on the left. You can park at either one. If its dry we can park on the grass. The greenhouse is behind them. We will set the chairs up in the small garage. Dress for the weather / mosquitoes. Hopefully it will be nice weather.

Spring bus trip: Time to get signed up for the spring bus trip. Saturday, May 20. The bus will be at Alton Square Mall, upper parking lot at Macy's. The bus will be loading at 7:30 am and depart at 8:00. Please don't be late, we will be leaving promptly at 8am. First stop will be Timberwinds Nursery in Ellisville, MO, www.TimberwindsNursery.com, then onto Papillon Perennials in Wildwood, MO, www.papillonperennials.com. Lunch will be in a fast food area. Last stop will be Hillermann Nursery and Florist in Washington, MO, www.hillermann.com. Cost is \$10 for members and \$18 for guests. Please contact Susan Ruckman for a seat on the bus and payment.
